Levy News:

The Board of Education will take the first step at its December meeting to place a **renewal levy** on the ballot in May 2014.

This emergency levy was originally passed in 1999, so it has been collected for nearly 15 years. The Board is asking voters to renew the levy for the same amount of money for ten years. Passing the levy results in

NO INCREASE IN TAXES.

Why is it called an emergency levy? "Emergency" is merely a term for <u>a specific dollar amount</u>. This emergency levy collects about \$2,705,000 per year and is needed for general day-to-day operating expenses.

Facility News:

The Board has scheduled a special work session on January 11th to tour all the buildings in the District and discuss facility planning. Board members want to see first-hand the condition of our buildings and be proactive about facility needs.
