Parent-Teacher Conferences

Parent-Teacher Conferences for our elementary students are on the evening of Nov. 14&21. Conferences are a valuable opportunity for teachers and parents to discuss your child's progress. When teachers and parents have open lines of communication both parties can learn how they can best help your child reach their full potential. Conferences are recommended for all parents of elementary students.

Conferences will be held from 4:30 pm-7:30 pm. Each conference will be fifteen (15) minutes per student. If your child received a Third Grade Reading Guarantee (TGRG) Letter, the conference could last up to thirty (30) minutes long. This time will be used to explain the TGRG and to develop a reading plan for your child.

Conferences are normally scheduled with your child's homeroom teacher. However, if you would like to meet with any other teachers your child may have, please indicate this when you schedule a conference and an additional time may be set up for you to accommodate this request. Likewise, if your child has a teacher, other than their homeroom teacher, who feels that a conference is needed, a note from that teacher will be sent home requesting that you meet with them as well.

Lastly, if you do not have a conference time scheduled, please call your child's teacher to schedule a conference time. If you are unable to call, please write a note to the teacher listing times that you are available to meet and a confirmation note will be sent home confirming a date and a time for the conference.
